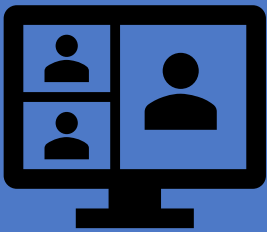

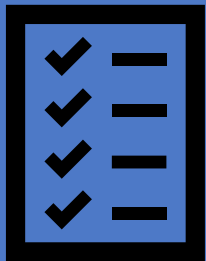

Why?

- Comprehensive Review & Analysis required product
- Helpful step before work on integrated transition planning
- Determine resources available in WI: strengths and gaps

What is it?

- Collection of our “assets”
- Many types
- Across 3 areas:

Health - 18-21 Transition & Post-secondary Education - Employment

Many overlapped, applicable to more than one area.
An asset that applied to all 3 areas is defined as an
“integrated asset.”

How to Determine the Top Assets?



Asset vs. Resource What's the Difference?

Criteria for top 10 **Integrated Assets**:

1. Is it an enduring resource (always available, not an event)?
2. What scope does it cover?
3. Three levels of resources to consider:
 - Broad resources** that lead to other resources or information/referral
 - How to resources** – policy, procedure or guides (for families; for professionals)
 - Stories/real life examples** that illustrate integrated transition

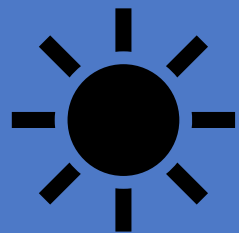

About the Project:

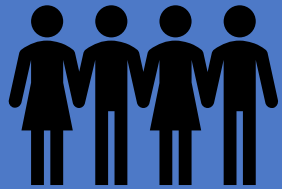
